- 3. Adults should do what's best for children
- 4. Your government should protect your rights as a child
- 6. You have the right to be alive
- 9. You have the right to live with your parents unless it's bad for you
- 12. You have the right to give your opinion, and for adults to take it seriously
- 16. You have the right to privacy
- 19. You have the right to be protected from being hurt and mistreated in body or mind
- 24. You have the right to the best health care possible, safe water and nutritious food.
- 27. You have the right to food, clothing and a safe place to live
- 28. You have the right to a good quality education
- 29. You have the right to develop your own talents and to learn to live peacefully and respect human rights
- 31. You have the right to rest and play.
- 33. You have the right to protection from harmful drugs and the drug trade
- 38. You have the right to protection and freedom from war
- 39. You have the right to help if you've been hurt, neglected or badly treated.
